KENNEBEC COUNTY, ss.

ON this *twenty second* day of *May*, 1820,
 personally appeared before *Mathew Weston Dunton* Chief Justice of
 the Circuit Court of Common Pleas, for the Counties of Lincoln, Kennebec and Somerset,
 being a Court of Record for said Counties, proceeding according to the course of the common
 law, having original jurisdiction, unlimited in amount, keeping a record of their proceedings, and
 having the power of fine and imprisonment, *Solomon Hallett* aged
sixty six years, resident in *Waterville* in the County of *Kennebec*
 within said Circuit, who being first duly sworn according to law, doth, on his oath, declare that he
 served in the Revolutionary war as follows, viz. in the Company commanded by Captain
Harwood and Regiment commanded by Colonel *Learned afterwards Col. Tupper*
 of the line of the State of *Massachusetts* upon the Continental Establishment, for
 the period of *one year*

that his original declaration was made before Judge *Wilde* on the
second day of *May* 1818; that he is now on the Maine
 Roll, and that his pension certificate is numbered *4557*. And I, the said *Solomon*
Hallett do further solemnly swear, that I was a resident citizen of the United States,
 on the eighteenth day of March, one thousand eight hundred and eighteen; and that I have not,
 since that time, by gift, sale, or in any manner whatever, disposed of my property, or any part
 thereof, with intent thereby so to diminish it as to bring myself within the provisions of an act of
 Congress, entitled, "An Act to provide for certain persons engaged in the land and naval service
 of the United States, in the Revolutionary War," passed on the eighteenth day of March, one
 thousand eight hundred and eighteen; and that I have not, nor has any person in trust for me, any
 property or securities, contracts or debts, due to me; nor have I any income, other than what is
 contained in the schedule hereto annexed, and by me subscribed.

The following is a Schedule of my whole Estate and income, necessary clothing and bedding
 excepted, viz:

- Twenty five acres of land very wet and low in said Waterville*
- with an outhouse and barn thereon, all of the value of three hundred dollars.*
- One horse of the value of thirty dollars.*
- Four cows of the value of eighty dollars.*
- One flock of geese of the value of sixty dollars.*
- Two hogs of the value of fourteen dollars.*
- Fourteen sheep of the value of twenty dollars.*
- Three swine of the value of fifty dollars.*
- Furniture, besides necessary bedding, of the value of...*
